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Major Trends in Local Finance

Total municipal revenues and expenditures grew by 3.7 percent to \$23.4 billion statewide in fiscal 2013, an improvement over the anemic growth during the recent recession but still less than the average annual growth of 5.2 percent between 1982 and 2009. At the same time, the costs for debt service, pension contributions, and employee and retiree health care are outpacing revenue growth, producing a long-term squeeze on municipal finances.

Revenues

The 3.7 percent growth in statewide municipal revenues in fiscal 2013 is notably better than the previous three years when growth was 2.7 percent, 1.1 percent, and 0.1 percent in fiscal years 2012, 2011, and 2010, respectively. The modest rebound was driven largely by an increase in state aid which, combined with a small improvement in local receipts, offset the smallest growth in property taxes in nearly three decades.

After three consecutive years of cuts, state aid to municipalities rose to \$4.8 billion in fiscal 2013, a 3.0 percent increase over the \$4.7 billion in fiscal 2012. Virtually all of the increase in state aid was dedicated to Chapter 70 funding, which climbed by 4.8 percent or \$160 million to \$3.52 billion in 2013 from \$3.36 billion in 2012. For the third consecutive year, unrestricted aid was funded at \$899 million—\$425 million less than the \$1.3 billion in the original fiscal 2009 budget approved by the Legislature. Like unrestricted aid, most other state aid accounts were essentially level funded or reduced in fiscal 2013, including public library support, reimbursements for charter school tuition, and the school lunch program.

Local receipts, such as motor vehicle excise taxes, meals and hotel taxes, building permits, and charges for services, grew by 3.3 percent in fiscal 2013 to \$4.2 billion. While this is an increase from recent years, collections were still below the average annual growth of 4.2 percent since 2000.

The small growth in local receipts in fiscal 2013 was largely due to increased revenues from licenses and permits as the economy has recovered, as well as increases in charges for water, sewer, and trash

services. The local hotel and meals taxes that were implemented in 2010 also continue to be a source of revenue growth for municipalities, totaling \$245 million statewide in 2013, up from \$222 million in 2012.¹

Despite upticks in state aid and local receipts, overall revenue growth was constrained because property taxes, which account for half of all municipal revenues, grew at their slowest since 1985, increasing by 3.6 percent, from \$13 billion in 2012 to \$13.4 billion in 2013. By contrast, between 1985 and 2012, property taxes rose an average of 5.4 percent annually.

The large majority of cities and towns have virtually no excess capacity, which is the additional amount a municipality may raise its levy in a given year without an override.² As a result, the only way for most communities to raise property taxes above the annual 2.5 percent increase is through new construction or overrides.

In fiscal 2013, new construction accounted for \$195 million of statewide property tax revenues, marking the fourth consecutive year in which growth from new construction added just 1.5 percent to the previous year's statewide tax levy.³ During the previous 22 years, from 1988 to 2009, new construction added an average of 2.5 percent per year to statewide property taxes.

At the same time, property tax overrides are on the decline. In fiscal 2013, voters approved just \$11 million in overrides, the lowest amount since 2000 and down from \$15 million in fiscal 2012 and a peak of \$49 million in fiscal 2006.

Expenditures

The budget squeeze facing municipalities has led to layoffs of more than 15,500 full-time employees, or six percent of the workforce, since 2007 (Table 1). The global recession and state fiscal crisis are partly responsible for these layoffs, but the larger and

¹ This includes 16 communities that adopted one or both taxes in fiscal 2013, accounting for \$3.4 million of the statewide total.

² Of the state's 351 communities, 224 have one percent or less of excess capacity (excluding debt exclusions because those do not increase the levy permanently).

³ Not every municipality raises the prior year's property tax levy by 2.5 percent each year, so the aggregate statewide levy increase is less than 2.5 percent, excluding new construction and overrides. For example, in fiscal 2013, municipalities increased property taxes on the existing base by approximately two percent, while new construction added 1.5 percent and overrides added 0.08 percent for total growth of 3.6 percent.

more permanent cause is the escalating spending on debt service, pensions, and health care. The fiscal squeeze will only worsen, even with an economic recovery, because municipalities have accrued billions in obligations without setting aside nearly enough funding to pay for these liabilities.

Debt service, the amount municipalities must pay annually in interest and principal for money they have borrowed, totaled \$2.26 billion in 2012, 10 percent of municipal spending.⁵ Between fiscal 2007 and 2012, debt service costs rose by 23 percent compared to overall spending growth of 13 percent.

Spending on employee and retiree benefits is also rising much faster than revenues. Pension costs grew nearly three times as fast as other municipal spending between fiscal 2007 and fiscal 2012 and more than twice as fast as revenue growth. In fiscal 2012, pension contributions totaled more than \$1.3 billion, a 30 percent increase from the \$1 billion in contributions in 2007.

Like pensions, spending on health care for employees and retirees grew much faster than revenues between 2007 and 2011. However, the widespread adoption of municipal health reform in 2012 reduced costs by \$30 million. Nevertheless, health care still accounts for nearly 10 percent of municipal budgets and will climb inexorably in the years to come.

⁴ Debt exclusions, which are included in the total for debt service, account for only a small share of debt service costs.

⁵ The state limits its borrowing so that annual debt service is no more than eight percent of that year's total revenues.

In addition, municipalities face \$30 billion in unfunded liabilities for retiree health care. If cities and towns made the required contributions to reduce that liability, it would certainly sink local budgets. However, even if they ignore the liability, municipalities cannot avoid the escalating costs: spending on retiree health care is projected to cost cities and towns more than \$1 billion within five years and \$1.5 billion in 10 years, compared to \$800 million in 2012.⁶

Spending on debt service and employee benefits will consume an ever larger share of municipal budgets for the foreseeable future. With modest revenue growth at best, funding for schools, public safety, and other services will be sacrificed in order to pay for the unaffordable obligations taken on by cities and towns over the past decades.

⁶ The health care figure in Table 1 is from data that is self-reported by municipalities. Some municipalities do not include the costs of their contributions to supplemental Medicare plans in that total. As a result, annual health care costs for municipal employees and retirees is likely higher than the reported figure.

Explanation of Tables

The following tables present local financial information for fiscal 2012 and 2013. There are two tables for each year: municipal financial data and community tax rates. In addition, for fiscal 2013 there are two tables detailing local debt and other characteristics. The following list explains column headings for each table.

Column Headings for 2012 and 2013 Municipal Financial Data Tables (with statewide totals for 2013)

Population

The 2010 population data from the 2010 U.S. Census. It is used to compute per capita statistics.
State Total: 6,547,629

Total Amount to Raise

The total of local expenditures, state and county assessments, and “overlay” reserves (the amount determined by the assessors for anticipated tax refunds, exemptions, and uncollected taxes).
2013 State Total: \$23.39 billion

Change

The percent change in the amount to raise from the prior fiscal year.
2013 State Average: 3.7 percent

Expenditures

Local

Total amounts budgeted by the city or town for local purposes in the fiscal year plus any additional lottery distributions available for expenditure. This includes amounts appropriated and amounts otherwise required to be raised by the municipality, such as regional school district assessments.
2013 State Total: \$22.9 billion

Change

The percent change in local expenditures from the prior fiscal year.

2013 State Change: 3.7 percent

Assessments

Total amounts assessed against the city or town on the “cherry sheet.” The amounts shown include charges for all state, county, and special district purposes but exclude regional school district, school choice, and charter school assessments.

2013 State Total: \$285 million

Change

The percent change in assessments from the prior fiscal year.

2013 State Change: -1.8 percent

Revenue Sources

Property Taxes

The amount the city or town must raise through real and personal property taxes. It is the difference between the total amount to be raised and the locality’s non-tax receipts.

2013 State Total: \$13.44 billion

Change

The percent change in property taxes from the prior fiscal year.

2013 State Change: 3.6 percent

Local Aid

Total amount paid by the state to the city or town as aid or reimbursements. This total is shown on the “cherry sheet,” a report issued yearly to a city or town estimating state and county charges and the state aid it will receive. The amount in our tables includes school building assistance payments. It excludes regional school aid and school choice tuition payments to receiving districts.

2013 State Total: \$4.82 billion

Change

The percent change in local aid from the prior fiscal year.

2013 State Change: 3.0 percent

Local Receipts

Estimated receipts from investment income, motor vehicle excise, hotel/motel tax, fees, fines, rentals, special assessments, community preservation funds, sales of services (e.g., municipal light, water, sewer), and other local sources.

2013 State Total: \$4.17 billion

Change

The percent change in fees and charges from the prior fiscal year.

2013 State Change: 3.3 percent

Note: Cities and towns support their expenditures with funds from several other non-tax sources, including any surpluses from prior years. They are not shown separately, but are included in the Total Amount.

Tax Limit

Under the provisions of Proposition 2½ the Department of Revenue (DOR) calculates a tax limit each year for each city and town. DOR takes the previous year's limit and adds 2.5 percent, plus the applicable tax on new construction and any taxes temporarily added to support local debt or capital expenditures. A community can tax up to its limit without a local override vote.

2013 Total: \$13.79 billion

Excess Capacity

The difference between the amount of property taxes that a municipality chooses to raise and the amount of taxes that could be raised under the tax limit. It represents the additional taxes a city or town may collect without overriding Proposition 2½.

2013 Total: \$345 million

Percent

Excess capacity expressed as a percent of total property taxes.

2013 State Total: 2.6 percent

Levy From Growth

The amount of property tax generated by growth in property value from new construction or major renovations. Communities can increase their tax limits by taxing such growth, but increases in property value due to community-wide revaluation of existing properties cannot be used to increase the tax limit.

2013 Total: \$195 million

Column Headings for 2012 and 2013 Tax Rates Tables

(with statewide totals for 2013)

Assessed Value

The total assessed valuation, as determined by the local assessors, of all taxable real and personal property as of January 1. Taxes for the fiscal year that ends on June 30 of the following year are based on this amount (for example, the assessed valuation as of January 1, 2012 provides the basis for fiscal 2013 taxes).

2013 State Total: \$904.09 billion

Year Certified

The year in which the community most recently completed a full, certified property revaluation (required every three years). The Municipal Relief Act of 2010 changed the assessment schedule so communities in the same region follow the same assessment schedule. As a result, some communities will wait longer than three years for the next assessment. While this is an indication of the currency of the assessed value, communities differ in how closely they maintain values between revaluations.

Tax Rates

Composite

This tax rate is calculated by dividing total property taxes by total assessed values and multiplying

by 1,000. For communities with a single tax rate it is the same as the actual rate. For multiple tax rate communities it is the rate that would be in effect if the community had a single rate.

2013 State Average: \$15.03 per \$1,000 of Assessed Valuation

Residential and Other Rates

The actual tax rates for each class of property.

Moody's Rating

The municipality's debt issuance rating by Moody's Investors Services as of July 2013. Current ratings may be found at www.moodys.com.

Standard and Poor's Rating

Debt per Capita

The amount of long-term debt outstanding as of July 1, 2012 divided by the 2010 population.

2013 State Average: \$1,957

Percent of Value

The same debt total divided by total equalized property valuation as of January 1, 2012, as determined by the Department of Revenue.

2013 State Average: 1.3 percent

Column Headings for Other Characteristics Table

Per Capita Amounts

2010 Income

Community income per capita as reported by the Census Bureau. Community income per capita, as determined by the Department of Revenue, is used in setting the state grant percentage for construction projects approved by the School Building Authority.

2010 State Average: \$35,917

Equalized Value per Capita

Total equalized property valuation as of January 1, 2012, as determined biennially by the Department of Revenue, divided by 2010 population.

2013 State Average: \$149,014

Expenditures per Capita

Total local expenditures divided by 2010 population.

2013 State Average: \$3,498

Comparative Single-Family Tax Bill

The 2013 residential tax rate multiplied by the average value of a single-family residence in Massachusetts in 2013, as reported by the Department of Revenue. The Department's calculation of the statewide single family average value excludes the 13 communities with residential exemptions, which account for 18 percent of the state's 2010 population.

2013 State Average: \$5,054

Percent Low-Income Students

Total number of low-income students in a community as a percent of 2013 foundation enrollment, as reported by the Department of Education. Low income status is determined by students' federal eligibility for free or reduced-price lunch. Low-income students attending regional school districts are allocated among member communities based upon the each community's share of the district's foundation enrollment.
